

“Quack Quack!

We new ducklings love our pond! We waddled super-fast from our nests as soon as we hatched and started swimming straight away. The Duck Squad tried hard to catch us but we’re too quick for them. There are 12 of us younger ones and two of us are nearly full grown but we love to swim around together.”



The first couple of broods have now been released and we put two lovely black and white females back onto our pond. They are inseparable and have settled in to life on the pond swimmingly. We carried them to the pond from The Maltings in a cat box with the mother duck waddling along beside them. The rest went to live on a farm pond in Preston Bissett where we hope they’ll be very happy.



Looking after the ducks in their hutches is relatively simple, not very time-consuming and it is good fun as you can see in this photo of Olivia, Mary and Kate. Catching them in the first place is incredibly difficult though if they’ve left their nesting garden and already made it to the pond.

There is a group of 12 ducklings all on the pond; one mother with four ducklings and a second mother with 8. No-one could catch them as they were just too fast and good at hiding.

Nick (our expert duck man) said that as they survived the storms and *fowl* weather we had when they first hatched that they must be made of pretty tough stuff and we should leave them on the pond.

We’re looking forward to another hatching in a few weeks’ time as there’s a mother duck who has just finished laying ten eggs. Now she is officially ‘brooding’ which means that she is sitting on her eggs. She may make occasional trips back to the pond and she will wander around the garden a couple of times each day. She won’t leave the nest for more than an hour at a time though and when she leaves it she piles extra feathers and leaves over the top of the eggs to insulate them and keep them warm. She plucks these feathers from herself to use in the nest so she has a bald spot for a while called her ‘brood patch’!

You may contact the Duck Squad on 07875 603 008 or Nick on 07931 307 595 if you have eggs or ducklings in your garden. The sooner the Duck Squad know about eggs and ducklings the better. We’re much more likely to be able to catch them if they’re still in a garden and we get chance to come to collect them. Give us a call if you’d like a hutch for 4 weeks so that you can rear the ducklings; it’s really not very hard and you can have all the equipment and ducks delivered to you if catching them puts you off! I’d love to hear from anyone who would be prepared to help catch them too – that does seem to be the hardest part of this whole process!

ROGATION - 20th May

Part of the route was lined with may trees covered in white blossom, like a bridal path, and after the walk we were treated to drinks of lemon or elderflower in an echo of the Royal Wedding cake. Many thanks to Di and Martin for their hospitality, to Mike and Di for planning the route, and to Revd Liz for a service which combined Rogation, important to us here in Water Stratford, with a day important to the Church everywhere, by adding the Pentecost Collect and a sonnet by the priest and poet (and rock musician and chaplain to our son's college!) Malcolm Guite. The whole occasion put me in mind of a sonnet by another priest and poet, Gerard Manley Hopkins, which starts, 'The world is charged with the grandeur of God' and ends, 'Because the Holy Ghost over the bent / World broods with warm breast and with ah! bright wings'.

LAMMAS 'Bread and Beer' - 15th July

Our first (in living memory at least) Lammas service will complete the cycle of agricultural services which started with Plough Sunday, then Rogation, followed by Lammas marking the beginning of the harvest and Harvest Festival its culmination. Lammas celebrates the first harvest of wheat and barley, hence the theme of Bread and Beer. So it would be great if anyone could bring some home-baked bread or home-brewed beer along to the service, or a bottle of their favourite brew. Of course, everyone is very welcome at this revival of an old tradition, whether or not they bring bread or beer!

236 Correspondence

Footpaths Report – received from S Churchfield. (full report available on the TPC webpage and noticeboard)

1. *Trees on Gorrell Lane; raised by a householder. The trees are over 50 years old (i.e. they pre-date the development of the site for housing). I have visited and explained that the PC only has responsibility for the footpath and the verges which abut it; the PC does not have responsibility for clearing land (including trees) unless they impact on the footpath and ownership of this parcel of land is not under the remit of the PC, it is still owned by the developer of Gorrell Close. The PC has taken the position that householders adjacent to this land should take responsibility for its maintenance, and a number of householders have dutifully done so. A few years ago, representation by the PC (supported by householders) was made to BCC to have some tree clearance in this same area because there were several dead trees and falling branches which were deemed a hazard to footpath walkers. The work was eventually undertaken by BCC. I ask the PC and our BCC representative Charlie Clare to resolve this problem since this has been a continuing one over many years.*

2. *Vegetation growth is at its peak and many parish footpaths are becoming overgrown, I seek permission to instruct Mr Stiles to undertake his occasional routine strimming of paths. Several residents have already taken responsibility for footpath clearance on their land. Notably, I would like thanks to go to Mrs Marianne Speed for clearance of Footpaths TN24 and TN28.*

3. *The Tingewick Parish Footpaths Walk was scheduled for 26-05-2018; advertised in Tingewick News, on the Facebook page Tingewick Life and by word of mouth. Unfortunately, the weather was poor and despite the offer of coffee and cake, no walkers turned up for the event.*

Silent Soldier – price increase for silhouette.

Clerk was notified that due to unforeseen circumstances, the price has increased from £100 to £150.

Be Aware of Courier Fraud and Scams

Thames Valley Police is warning residents to be vigilant following reports of courier frauds, which have involved offenders posing as police officers.

Scams are constantly changing and becoming ever more complex and harder to spot. Fraudsters are very convincing and spin complicated and elaborate stories to commit the fraud.

In May a resident in Haddenham received a phone call from a man claiming he was a Detective Sergeant from Luton Police, advising him that two arrests had been made following fraudulent activity on his account, but that the money had been returned.

The man then suggested to the victim he should call his bank so that he could get assurances from them.

Offenders will often use this call-back trick to gain your trust, leading you to believe you have ended one call and redialled a new number. However, the offender merely leaves the line open so unfortunately you are still speaking to the original fraudster.

The victim was then asked to withdraw £5,400 from his bank as evidence for the original theft. The alleged DS then said that he would need to check the serial numbers of the notes, as he suspected that they were counterfeit. The offender then arranged to collect the 'fake' cash from the victim's house using a code word.

It is unlikely that this money will ever be recovered.

Two similar recent frauds have also been reported in the Thame area.

There is a Banking Protocol where banks have agreed to notify the police of all suspicious and out of character withdrawals made by individuals, but fraudsters are attempting to avoid this detection by briefing victims with bogus stories. Fraudsters will often have access to genuine, large corporation bank accounts with worldwide links where fraudulent funds are moved and transferred undetected across the world at the press of a button.

Your bank or the police would never ask you to meet them at a location and hand over money or anything valuable.

Your bank or the police will never call you asking you to verify your personal details or PIN by phone or offer to pick up your card by courier. Hang up if you get a call like this.

If you have any doubts regarding the legitimacy of the call please disconnect your telephone at the wall, plug the phone back in and call 101.

Please pass this information on as fraudsters often target older or vulnerable people in our community. Victims often experience a sense of shame and social isolation as a result of the scam.

If you are interested in helping to spread scam prevention knowledge to your friends, family or neighbours why not visit the Friends Against Scams website. This is a National Trading Standards initiative, aiming to protect and prevent people from being victims of scams.

TSB Port Out Alert

There was an increase in reports made in May by TSB customers relating to "port-out" fraud.

Fraudsters are number porting a victim's telephone number to a SIM card under their control and then using the number to access the victim's bank accounts.

The increase in the number of reports corresponds with the timing of TSB's computer system update, which resulted in 1.9 million users being locked out of their accounts. Opportunistic fraudsters are using TSB's system issue to target individuals, which follows the increase in

phishing and smishing communications also targeting TSB customers this month. Victims' bank account and personal details including their phone number are collected by the fraudster, providing them with the information to execute the fraud.

Number porting is a genuine service provided by telecommunication companies. It allows customers to keep their existing phone number and transfer it to a new SIM card. The existing network provider sends the customer a Port Authorisation Code (PAC), that when presented to the new provider allows the number to be transferred across. This service can, however, be abused by fraudsters.

To gain control of the victim's phone number, fraudsters convince the victim's mobile phone network provider to swap their number on to a SIM card in the fraudster's control. Once the fraudster has control of the number they are able to intercept the victims' text messages, allowing them to use services linked to the victim's phone number. This can include requesting an online banking password reset or access to any two factor authentication services.

Victims have reported large losses as a result of this fraud. One victim initially dismissed text messages received from their network provider containing a PAC number. Two days later £6,000 was removed from the victim's TSB current account. The victim subsequently contacted their phone provider and was informed that someone contacted the provider purporting to be the victim and had cancelled their contract and transferred their number to a new SIM. This action allowed the banking fraud to take place.

Protect Yourself:

PAC Code notifications

If you receive an unsolicited notification about a PAC Code request, contact your network provider immediately to terminate the request. Also notify your bank about your phone number being compromised.

Clicking on links/files:

Don't be tricked into giving a fraudster access to your personal or financial details. Never automatically click on a link in an unexpected email or text. Remember, criminals can spoof the phone numbers and email addresses of companies you know and trust, such as your bank.

Requests to move money:

A genuine bank or organisation will never contact you out of the blue to ask for your PIN, full password or to move money to another account.

Port-out Fraud versus SIM Swapping

Port-out fraud is often incorrectly referred to as SIM swap fraud. SIM swap fraud works in a similar fashion, however, instead of porting the victim's number to a new network provider, the fraudster impersonates the victim and requests a new SIM card for their account. Once they have access to the new sim, they have access to the number.

TSB Phishing Attacks

There has been a sharp rise in fraudsters sending out fake text messages (smishing) and phishing emails claiming to be from TSB. The increase in the number of reports corresponds with the timing of TSB's computer system update, which resulted in 1.9 million users being locked out of their accounts. Opportunistic fraudsters are using TSB's system issue to target people with this type of fraud.

Since the start of May there have been 321 phishing reports of TSB phishing made to Action Fraud. This is an increase of 970% on the previous month. In the same reporting period, there have been 51 reports of cybercrime to Action Fraud which mention TSB – an increase of 112% on the previous month.

Fraudsters are commonly using text messages as a way to defraud unsuspecting victims out of money. Known as smishing, this involves the victim receiving a text message purporting to be from TSB. The message requests that the recipient clicks onto a website link that leads to a phishing website designed to steal online banking details.

Although text messages are currently the most common delivery method, similar communications have been reported with fraudsters using email and telephone to defraud individuals.

In several cases, people have lost vast sums of money, with one victim losing £3,890 after initially receiving a text message claiming to be from TSB. Fraudsters used specialist software which

changed the sender ID on the message so that it looked like it was from TSB. This added the spoofed text to an existing TSB message thread on the victim's phone.

The victim clicked on the link within the text message and entered their personal information. Armed with this information, the fraudsters then called the victim back and persuaded them to hand over their banking authentication code from their mobile phone. The fraudsters then moved all of the victim's savings to a current account and paid a suspicious company.

Protect Yourself:

Don't assume an email or text is authentic:

Always question uninvited approaches in case it's a scam. Phone numbers and email addresses can be spoofed, so always contact the company directly via a known email or phone number (such as the one on the back of your bank card).

Clicking on links/files

Don't be tricked into giving a fraudster access to your personal or financial details. Never automatically click on a link in an unexpected text or email. Remember, a genuine bank will never contact you out of the blue to ask for your full PIN or password.

Burglary Prevention Advice For The Summer Months

As the weather is getting warmer and the evenings are getting brighter, many of us will be leaving doors and windows open to keep our homes cool. Sadly, these can offer easy targets for opportunistic burglars, so be sure to follow these simple steps to prevent thieves spoiling your summer:

Ensure that windows and doors are closed and locked when you are out, even small windows.

If you want to leave windows open while you sleep, fit window restrictors so they cannot be fully opened, or be sure that they are not large enough to allow access to a burglar.

When out in your garden ensure that windows and doors to the front of the house are secure. It only takes a second for someone to get into your home and take things without you noticing.

Do not leave valuables on display in front of windows or in reach of open windows or doors.

Ensure that all barbecue and garden equipment and tools are securely locked up in a shed and out of sight. Tools can be used by the potential offender to break in to your home.

Consider fitting outside security lighting, a visible alarm or CCTV cameras to help deter burglars.

Even using pea shingle or gravel on a driveway and spiky plants in garden beds can help.

Don't leave any keys near entry points where they can be 'fished' or 'hooked' out through the window, letter box or cat flap.

Ensure any internal handle operated locks on UPVC doors are fully secured with a key.
