

# **Tingewick FC**



On such a hot day, hats and water bottles were the important accessories but it was lovely to reach the cool of the pub for our meal and some very cold drinks!





#### Courier Fraud

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau has identified an increasing number of reports submitted to Action Fraud from the public concerning courier fraud.

Fraudsters are contacting victims by telephone and purporting to be a police officer or bank official. To substantiate this claim, the caller might be able to confirm some easily obtainable basic details about the victim such as their full name and address. They may also offer a telephone number for the victim to call to check that they are genuine; this number is not genuine and simply redirects to the fraudster who pretends to be a different person. After some trust has been established, the fraudster will then, for example, suggest;

- Some money has been removed from a victim's bank account and staff at their local bank branch are responsible.

- Suspects have already been arrested but the "police" need money for evidence.

- A business such as a jewellers or currency exchange is operating fraudulently and they require assistance to help secure evidence.

Victims are then asked to cooperate in an investigation by attending their bank and withdrawing money, withdrawing foreign currency from an exchange or purchasing an expensive item to hand

over to a courier for examination who will also be a fraudster. Again, to reassure the victim, a safe word might be communicated to the victim so the courier appears genuine.

At the time of handover, unsuspecting victims are promised the money they've handed over or spent will be reimbursed but in reality there is no further contact and the money is never seen again. Protect Yourself -

Your bank or the police will never:

- Phone and ask you for your PIN or full banking password.

- Ask you to withdraw money to hand over to them for safe-keeping, or send someone to your home to collect cash, PIN, cards or cheque books if you are a victim of fraud.

Don't assume an email or phone call is authentic

Just because someone knows your basic details (such as your name and address or even your mother's maiden name), it doesn't mean they are genuine. Be mindful of who you trust – criminals may try and trick you into their confidence by telling you that you've been a victim of fraud Stay in control -

If something feels wrong then it is usually right to question it. Have the confidence to refuse unusual requests for personal or financial information

#### Watch Out For Fake Texts About Your EE Bill

These fake text messages purport to be from EE and claim that you haven't paid a bill. The link in the message leads to a phishing website designed to steal your EE account login details, as well as personal & financial information.

Don't be tricked into giving a fraudster access to your personal or financial details. Never automatically click on a link or attachment in an unexpected email or text.

#### Follow Up Calls Computer Software Service Fraud

There is concern that victims of previous Computer Software Service Fraud (CSSF) are being re-targeted for "owed money". The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) reports that CSSF scammers are returning to contact previous victims, requesting that they pay money owed for a fake malware protection service they had provided. Alternatively, the fraudster will ask for a new subscription fee in return for protection from a new threat. The victims that have made payments to the fraudsters have done so via credit/debit card payments. In some instances threatening and aggressive language has been used against victims, as part of the attempt to coerce them into sending money.

Computer Software Service Fraud involves the victim being contacted, told that there is a problem with their computer, and that for a fee this issue can be resolved. The aim of the fraudster at this point is usually to gain remote access to the victim's computer and, subsequently, access to their online banking account. No fix actually occurs. The victims will often be cold-called or will receive a pop-up on their computer, prompting them to phone the suspect.

Since the beginning of this year (2018), the total loss for repeat victims of CSSF has been reported as £16,712.85. The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau has noticed an increase in such reports since the beginning of May.

Protect Yourself

• If you receive such an unsolicited call or pop-up, do not make a payment. Always ensure you know who you are talking to. If in doubt, hang up immediately.

• Do not allow remote access to your computer.

• Don't be rushed or pressured into making a decision. Under no circumstances would a genuine bank, or another trusted organisation, force you to make a financial transaction on the spot; they would never ask you to transfer money into another account for fraud reasons. Remember to stop and take time to carefully consider your actions.

• Listen to your instincts. If something feels wrong then it is usually right to question it. Criminals may lull you into a false sense of security when you are out and about or rely on your defences being down when you're in the comfort of your own home. They may appear trustworthy, but they may not be who they claim to be.

#### Don't make it easy for opportunist burglars

Make sure that you don't leave a window open in a part of your home that is out of your view – it only takes a moment for someone to get in and steal anything readily accessible.

Keep car keys out of sight and don't leave door keys in the lock.

If you're going away think about what sensitive information you might be sharing on social media.

Report anyone acting suspiciously to the police, either on 101 or 999 if a crime is happening. Call at the time that you see it and try to get a description of them.

#### 245 County Councillor's Report:

Cllr Clare loved the Fete and commented that it was thoroughly enjoyable.

In 2017 there was a consultation for BCC Children's Services; how to improve services to prevent young people needing more drastic services later in life – the consultation is being done again. There is a consultation at the moment for the Winslow to Buckingham cycle path to possibly be extended down London Road to the Swan Centre.

All the roads by the end of June 2018 had really tall grass. The one cut per year was voted in with extra money going to wards roads and potholes etc but swathe cutting is happening now and Cllr Clare did some strimming in Gawcott as he knew that children used the path and that he could not get it done otherwise. Unfortunately, the once a year cutting cannot be done earlier and were it not for Silverstone, would actually be done later in the season.

Vision splay at junctions is a priority and those cuts are scheduled four times per year, however if growth limits visibility, Cllr Clare asks to be contacted and informed.

Cllr Clare predicts the same problems next year and the year after so will be putting a call out to get together a group of wiling volunteers to help get on to the worst sections; it's his belief that a team of approximately 10 volunteers working over four weekends should be enough.

Extra work is being done on the A422 to prepare for the planned resurfacing.

Edgcott Road has had £300,000 spent on it recently, which is more than the last decade combined. The road will still be problematic, though better than previous.

On Monday 9<sup>th</sup> July 2018 the south side of Radclive Road will be closed from the A421 roundabout up to Gawcott; businesses in the industrial centres will still be operating but access will be limited for general traffic.

Cllr Clare advised that there are a lot of street light issues but they have not been followed up as the priority recently has been on the roads. When the roads in Gawcott are done he will start to look at the street lighting issues.

Potholes were marked last week between Tingewick and Finmere, many have been filled. The new "tarmac machine" has been seen filling potholes in some surrounding villages but not yet in Tingewick. There is a pothole developing at the Tingewick roundabout as you turn in to the village which will be monitored and reported.
