

Finally, keep an eye on this space as we make plans to extend the club further by making football accessible to more age groups.



Blocked drains scam

Thames Valley Police have received recent reports of a scam, where residents are told that there is a problem with their drains.

Victims are being contacted by people claiming to be either from Thames Water or Dyno Rod, saying that their drains are blocking and require specialist equipment to clean them, costing around £500 to hire. At one property in Wendover the money was handed over and we are aware of several other attempts in Aylesbury.

If you receive an unsolicited phone call, or someone comes to your property, don't always believe what they are saying. The Scammer will try and get your confidence and may use technical information, to make it sound like they know what they are talking about. Consider using a call-blocking service, which will stop calls that aren't in your address book coming through, unless you authorise them.

Watch out for these fake Netflix emails

We've seen an increase in reports about fake Netflix emails claiming that there's an issue with your account, or that your account has been suspended. The email states that you need to "update" your account details in order to resolve the problem. The link in the emails leads to genuine-looking Netflix phishing websites designed to steal your username and password, as well as payment details.

Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information in case it's a scam. Never automatically click on a link in an unexpected email or text. For more information on how to stay secure online, visit <u>www.cyberaware.gov.uk</u>

Cllr Clare is interested in hearing how people are getting on with the roundabout works. Attended a meeting today about future scheduling; informed those responsible the max. acceptable is a 15minute delay for motorists. When there is only a 5- or 10-minute delay, it's no quicker to divert through Gawcott and hopefully "village traffic only" signs will be put up in the future.

The road to Stowe will be shut during the day until Wednesday next week for works to be done to fix the water on the road, significant drains will be put in, like on Water Stratford Road.

There will be night works to repair the road on the A422 south of Radclive, in October.

Cllr Clare sent a "massive thank you" stating he is really very grateful to Cllr Fenemore for dealing with the continually persistent problem of the lump of soil on the verge of Sandpit Hill.

274 District Councillor's Report

20mph speed limit; exploring the possibility of it being enforced in peak school times. Application is coming to the LAF next week; may come up under priorities, needing to be voted on. Elections scheduled for 2nd May 2019, however this may be put back by two years, pending the outcome of the unitary proposal, for which the Ministers' response is still awaited. AVDC is looking at expansion, with the expressway and the requirement from the Government to deliver 300,000 homes nationally, pressure is on Local Authority's to deliver more homes. The Parish Council was advised by a professional, that the amount of food currently donated should be sufficient; except for in the Spring time when the new ducklings are hatched.

It is felt that the current duck population may be greater than it should be and that the ducks, like other wild animals, will seek out food sources further afield if what is provided is not enough for the current population.

Cllr Fenemore thanked them both for doing it.

BCC sent an invoice for £700 for the fees associated with the purchase of the Rec Ground, the Trust's lawyer advised they appeal against it; Cllr Clare helped and it was lowered to £350. Cllr Lightfoot sends many thanks to Cllr Clare for his assistance.

The 100 Club bank account will soon be closed and the funds will be officially transferred to the Trust, anyone wishing to continue their support should sign up to the Vale Lottery.
