





Eleanor as always had organised a lovely programme of readings. We had mulled wine and mince pies (thank you everybody for helping),and everybody stayed and enjoyed a good chat. Lots of introductions were made among village people which was great. About £300 was raised, half of which went to Brackley Hogwatch to help the hedgehogs and the other half to The Bus Shelter UK – a double decker bus parked in Campbell Park, Milton Keynes that is equipped to take 16 homeless people every night. Many facilities are available to help men and women get back to normal life.

The Crib Service on Christmas Eve was full to bursting – with 99 people attending! Thank you to Martin Hornsey, Tony Hawkins, David Ridgeway, Clive Sercombe and Robert Floyd for ringing the bells. The children loved having a wrapped up figure to put in the Crib when their turn came.

It was very nice to see some different faces at The Christmas Eve Holy Communion. I know that 9pm was not an easy time for some, but an earlier time obviously suited others!

So now we look forward to a new year in the Church. Our next project is to repoint some of the exterior stonework. We are gathering quotations for this work. If you can help in any way please let us know. A Church that is 1000 years old needs a lot of TLC!

There will be events taking place during the year which I will write about in March. We have an AGM of the PCC (Parochial Church Council) coming up in March/April. I shall be standing down as churchwarden in order to spend more time with Anthony and our family. I hope to remain on the PCC committee and will still have duties!

Finally my heartfelt thanks goes out to all of our regular benefactors who have been most generous in their giving. Without them we simply would not have a church.

HM Revenue and Customs Alert

What you need to know

Action Fraud has experienced an increase in the reporting of malicious calls, voicemails, text messages or emails to members of the public purporting to be from HMRC.

The fraudsters state that as a result of their non-payment of tax or other duty, the victim is liable to prosecution or other legal proceedings such as repossession of belongings to settle the balance but can avoid this by arranging for payment to be made immediately by method such as bank transfer or by iTunes gift cards.

If the victim is hesitant or refuses to comply, the suspect makes a threat such as immediate arrest bailiffs or in cases where the victim appears to be of overseas origin; deportation.

Often, the period for which the tax is allegedly due is distant enough to guarantee the victim will have little, if any, paperwork or ability to verify the claims. Once the money is paid the suspects sever all contact.

It is vital that the public exercise caution when receiving messages or telephone calls of this nature.

What you need to do

Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information. Just because someone knows your basic details (such as your name and contact details), it doesn't mean they are genuine. Instead, contact the company directly using trusted methods such as a known email address or phone number.

Listen to your instincts. If something feels wrong then it is usually right to question it. No genuine organisation will ask you to pay taxes, bills or fees using iTunes Gift Cards, or any other type of voucher.

Don't be rushed or pressured into making a decision. Under no circumstances would a genuine bank or some other trusted organisation force you to make a financial transaction on the spot.

Report Phishing attempts. If you receive a call, text or email of this nature and have not lost money, report this as a phishing attempt to Action Fraud.

Alert - Fake TV Licensing Emails

Action Fraud has received more than 5,000 reports about fake emails and texts purporting to be from TV Licensing. The messages contain links to genuine-looking websites that are designed to steal personal and financial information.

Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information in case it's a scam. Never automatically click on a link in an unexpected email or text.


U9/10's

328 County Councillor's Report

Will report back to BCC regarding the drain on Main Street near the shop; though it has been repaired it is too high.

Dave from Transport for Bucks has received a promotion and will no longer be the designated Local Area Technician, his replacement will be announced soon.

More money going into roads next year, than this year.

Tingewick Road roundabout; delay due to water mains. Expect completion end February 2019.

329 District Councillor's Report:

Utilities disrupting roads, Anglian water repairing piping etc. have taken up with the relevant manager as it seems an incredible waste of money to be quickly repairing areas over and over, eg; an area on A421 was repaired then the road dropped and the main burst again.

Working toward the Unitary Authority; Colleagues meeting with Martin Tett and working on orders to go before Parliament.

Thanks for letter re; Planning. AVDC have received many other complaints also and the Parish Liaison role has been extended to deal with queries and get planners to contact councils. Meeting with Planners on Tuesday and will raise the errors that have been mentioned.

330 Matters Arising:

Item 255 – Parking

The Parking notice went in to the Tingewick News.

The application for double yellow lines was submitted to the Local Area Forum and a breakdown of cost was received. It was felt that the cost is too high and agreed that this will be held over until the new year to see if the Parking Notice in the magazine has any effect.

Though the Parking Notice does not seem to have had any effect, the PC are still reluctant to progress with the double yellow lines as it is felt it will just move the parking problems elsewhere. It was agreed to keep the Parking Notice running in Tingewick News every other month with edits made to name the specific problem areas.

• Item 262 – District Councillors Report, 20 mile per hour speed limit,

The application for 20 mile per hour speed limit near the school was submitted to the Local Area Forum and a breakdown of cost was received. It was felt that the cost is too high and agreed that Cllr Hornsey will set the MVAS by the school to collect driver speed information to evidence if there is a need for the speed limit to be permanently changed to 20mph.

Cllr Fealey advised that this is still a priority, though he noted the cost is horrendous.

The PC will explore alternative signage to be displayed around the school.

• Item 307 – Correspondence; Noxious Weed in Tingewick, email from Preston Bissett PCI. Letter sent and was returned; Cllr Maxwell to visit the site.

Cllr Maxwell did visit the site and met with a tenant, though not the land owner. He will go back to the land owner's property in the next week.

• Open Forum – December 2018: Pinch-Point

Cllr Maxwell will draft a letter of opposition to AVDC and include Cllr Fealey on the distribution, noting that the pinch-point is ineffective, in a dangerous position and considered unnecessary. An official motion was raised that the TPC do not want the pinch-point moved as originally agreed with Bovis; they would like it completely removed.
