# **Protect Your Vehicles & Property**

There have been an increased number of thefts from vehicles in the past few weeks so I thought it important to review some things that we can all do to help keep our vehicles safe.

### 1. Always Lock It

This may sound obvious, but if you're in a rush it can be all too easy to press the wrong button on your remote - or forget to press it at all. Always double check you've locked your car before walking away.

### 2. Make Sure Windows And Sunroofs Are Fully Closed

In the hot weather you may be tempted to keep the sunroof or windows open a little bit to allow air to circulate. This allows people to "fish" in your car with a bent coat-hanger (or similar) and fish out your valuables.

### 3. Take It With You

Never leave your wallet, purse, sat nav, laptop etc. in your car. You may think it's well hidden but if someone gains access to your car they will probably find it - and you may also find that you're not covered by your insurance if valuables aren't properly secured in your car.

### 4. Don't Leave Any Clues

Leaving sat nav mounts, phone holders and ring marks on your windscreen gives away that you may have valuable items in your car. Even if they can't see it, a thief may break in and try to find it.

### 5. Mark Your Catalytic Converter

Thefts of these are becoming increasingly common. Ask your local garage about manufacturer approved locks or guards and consider having it security marked.

### 6. Keep Your Keys Away From Doors And Windows

Keep your keys away from easily accessible areas. Additionally, if your car has keyless entry, make sure it's a sufficient distance away from your vehicle so it can't be used as a "bridge" to trick the car into thinking you're near it. You can buy <u>Faraday Bags</u> that block the key signal for extra peace of mind.

### **CELEBRATING THE SEASON**

### WHITER RAILINGS

The railings, a historic village landmark, have now been smartened up with a new coat of white paint: thanks to Susan for organising this improvement.

### **COLLECTION BAGS AND BOX**

We have received a very special parting gift from Eleanor, who has now moved away from the area. A skilled embroiderer, she has designed and made two matching collection bags – she may have noticed that our current ones are somewhat the worse for wear, probably having been nibbled by mice! The central design echoes a detail in our east window, with corn and grapes suggesting the bread and wine of communion; this is encircled by all the liturgical colours of white, red, green and purple, so that the bags are suitable for use throughout the church year. Surrounding the circle are four leaves in colours which represent the four seasons, appropriate for our rural parish. It is an exquisite piece of work. We are going to miss Eleanor's friendship and her talents (licensed preacher, published writer, mainstay of the choir, educator, poet...) and are grateful to have these beautiful signed and dated bags to remember her by. We wish her and her family much happiness in their new home: they are settling in during a challenging time – as Eleanor wrote in one of her poems, based on the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm, 'He leads me into uncertainty.'

Another form of collection receptacle was a wooden box inscribed WP1711CW – presumably the churchwarden in 1711 had the initials WP (CW being an abbreviation for churchwarden, also seen on some of our bells). This had to be sent to the diocese for safekeeping as a historic artefact many years ago, but Chris's father had a replica made. We look forward to dedicating all three items when we are able to resume services.

I'm sure the Village would like to join me in thanking the organisers and cake bakers for putting on such a wonderful event.


