DOG FOULING IS AN OFFENCE!

The Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 requires all dog owners to clean up after their dog if the dog fouls in a place to which the public has access. Dog wardens are authorised to serve fixed penalty notices on anyone allowing their dog to foul in a public place; offenders can be issued with a fine of up to £1,000 if the case goes to court.

Dog fouling is more effectively tackled when the whole community works together. The majority of dog owners act responsibly, but there are those that don't and think they can get away with not picking up after their pet. If repeat dog fouling offences are reported, irresponsible dog owners may think twice about their actions.

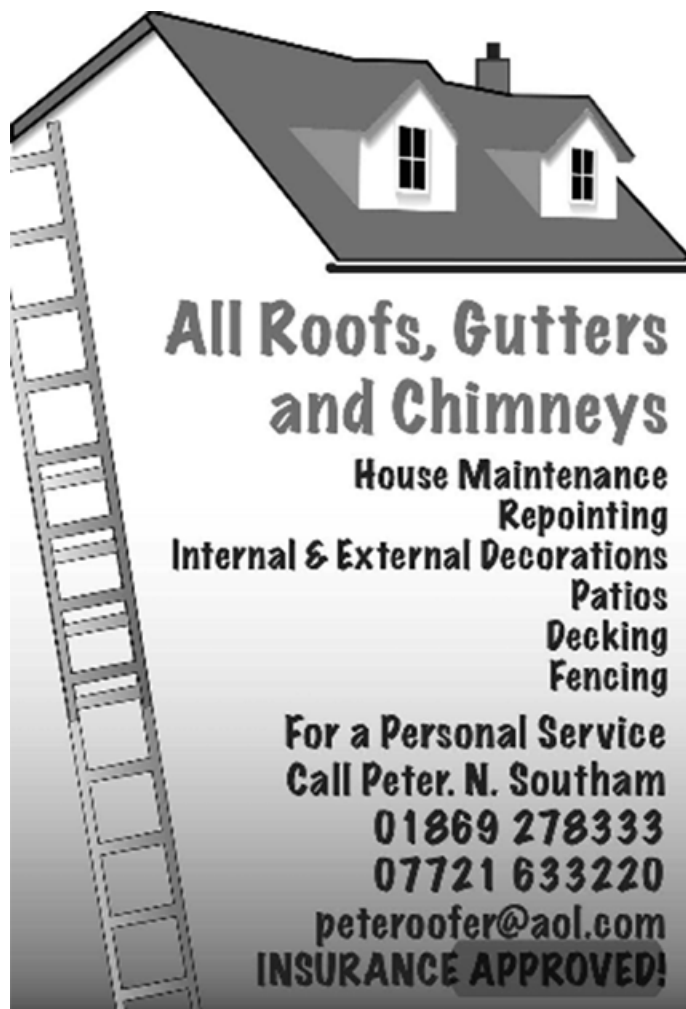

COVID-19 vaccine - think before you share

Buckinghamshire Council is urging residents to think and check before they share information online about the COVID-19 vaccine. While many posts on social media and other channels tell positive stories about peoples' experiences, there is a large amount of misinformation about the vaccine spreading online.

It's essential to get any information about the COVID-19 vaccine from a reliable source, such as the NHS or Government's websites. It's also really important that people are aware of the **following facts** about the COVID-19 vaccine:

- It has been through the same strict safety checks that all vaccines go through
- The vaccine is suitable for vegetarians and vegans. It does not contain any animal products or egg and imams have stated the vaccines are halal
- Any side effects are mild other than in extremely rare cases – as is the case with all vaccines and medicines
- You cannot get COVID-19 from having the vaccine – it contains no live virus and cannot cause infection
- The COVID-19 vaccine offers the best possible protection from COVID-19, which carries significant health risks if you catch it

Thinking before sharing something on social media that could be potentially harmful or misleading is key and the advice is to take 5 seconds to consider:

- If it's a rumour, don't send it on
- Check the facts and get information from trusted sources
- Ask yourself, how does the person who's sent this know it's true?

Martin Tett, Leader of Buckinghamshire Council said:

“Of course, having the vaccine is a matter of personal choice, but it's critical we all do our bit to avoid a situation where someone refuses a vaccine as they've ended up seeing misinformation about it online. We have a collective responsibility to make sure any information we share online about the vaccine is true and accurate. The vaccine is safe, it's been through the same rigorous programme of checks that all vaccines go through, and it categorically does not contain any animal or egg products. It's essential that people can make a fully informed decision about whether to have this vaccine. It's also crucial that as many people choose to have the vaccine as possible as it's currently our main route out of this pandemic.”

OPEN FORUM:

Gill Barstow introduced herself, she is from The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints and looks after Communications for a region of the stake/church encompassing a bit of Buckinghamshire, Bedfordshire, Milton Keynes and Northamptonshire.

“I Dig Trees” which was discussed before is no longer involved as with lockdown and timings they allocated all the trees they had so another supplier was found “The Tree Appeal” will provide trees free of charge, the Church is offering the labour.

When Ms Barstow first spoke with Cllr Lightfoot, things were not as locked down as they are now and the Church could have mobilised 30+ people but now they could probably only call on one family/bubble at a time to do the planting.

The best time for planting is up to late March – early April.

Ms Barstow will send to TPC the list of the types of trees available; they are all cell-grown whips of British native species. They are between 30 – 100cm high, with a cane and a rabbit spiral. They are delivered for free and the number of trees is not as restrictive now so the quantity can be chosen. Other organisations nearby have expressed interest including Lace Hill Academy, The Royal Latin and Buckingham Canal Society.

Ms Barstow explained the process starts by choosing the trees you want, giving consideration to how the trees will be watered and cared for, applying for the trees and then arranging a date for planting. Ms Barstow briefly explained there is criteria for the application she will send to TPC.

Action: TPC to meet on Monday afternoon for a walk around the village to explore possible locations for the trees and then advise Ms Barstow ASAP.

Action: Once the locations are chosen, Clerk to write to Cllr Stuchbury so he can ask the Cabinet minister for permission for any that are wished to be planted on Buckinghamshire Council land.

631 Unitary Authority Councillor’s Reports

Cllr Stuchbury advised that there will be a meeting on 24th February 2021 for setting Council Tax. There was an Audit Committee meeting recently, Cllr Stuchbury feels the Treasury report does not seem in line with environmental potentials.

Cllr Stuchbury will be coming to look at the pond at the weekend, with Cllr Lightfoot.

Cllr Stuchbury will be going to Cabinet on the 16th and will ask questions around education – he worries that children sitting their 11+ this year might not be children who would have qualified ordinarily.

The budget is to be set for Elderly care; Cllr Stuchbury is concerned they are under stress with Covid.

There is a HS2 meeting on at moment; Cllr Fealey is there.

The council are scheduling their roads program, it looks like finally Buckingham street has gotten back onto road scheme! Though they have started to include plane and patch as a capital program, Cllr Stuchbury thinks it will iron itself out.

Cllr Stuchbury has just been to the weekly Covid meeting, we’re doing better than some parts of Buckinghamshire; even though we started later, we are getting more people done (vaccinated) than some areas of South Bucks.

They are not wasting the vaccines, if people do not turn up, the vaccines go to other key workers who are not in that age profile.

Cllr Fealey joined the meeting after the HS2 meeting.

He advised that the Parish Charter Survey is out.

The Heritage Portal has been set up at Buckinghamshire.co.uk and includes Tingewick.

Regards the support for school, (under correspondence) they have the tools and will pay for the DBS checks on any volunteers. He noted that the school does not have a caretaker and that the help would be needed first thing in the morning to clear paths etc for the children but it won't be needed for every day.

Lateral flow tests are available for people who are unable to work from home in Buckingham from next week, tests can be booked online and will be done at the Swan Pool.

The vaccine roll out has been really good locally. 27,000 doses of the vaccine were delivered this week and the same again will be delivered next week.

The rate of infection in the over 60's has gone down, however the area of concern now is for 11–15-year-olds as it has gone up by 43%.

Round three of the business support grant is now open for applications for January 2021.

Cllr Fealey is concerned about the closure of the bridge at the end of bypass going toward Bicester.

The first element will be carrying out some tests and they may put a bailey bridge in temporarily.

The re-route for it is out to the A43, though Cllr Fealey suspects people will go through the back of Gawcott instead.

Laptops have been delivered and checked for the schools to distribute to students.

- *Item 615 – Tree Planting Project*

Cllr Lightfoot advised Gill Barstow and "I Dig Trees" want to plant 2021 trees in Buckinghamshire. The trees come in packs of 50, they are donated and there is a team who will plant them so there is no cost to the Village. TPC has signed us up for one pack.

Cllr Lightfoot has information about the trees that she will forward to the other Councillors, Gill will be invited to join the PC in February 2021. Planting is planned for March – April.

635 Councillors' Reports and Items for Future Agenda

For each Councillor to report matters of information not included elsewhere on the agenda, to agree urgent actions and to raise items for future agendas.

- Cllr Lightfoot – Street Lighting & Defibrillator.

Cllr Lightfoot advised that all is ok with the street lighting and defibrillator.

Regards the flashing school lights, the technician had to take them away to source the correct fixture to attach them to the posts, Cllr lightfoot is awaiting another installation date and will follow up.

Anglian Water have been to put their CCTV equipment in suspected problem areas, they did find an issue further up West Well and are now dealing with the problem.

Cllr Lightfoot sourced the minutes of a meeting held in the mid-80's regarding when the lining was put in the Pond, which she has circulated to the rest of the council.

Cllr Lightfoot suggested that we need to "get in and check" for silt/gravel and to work out if the pond needs clearing. This will be explored further at the weekend.

- Cllr Hornsey – Playgrounds, Footways and Street Furniture.

Nothing new to report the only thing ongoing is the matter of the water running down the footpath on Stockleys Lane which has been reported.

Cllr Maxwell advised that he has rung Anglian Water twice; they have been out to the site twice and they have tested the water and are adamant that as there is no chlorine present it is not drinking water so he has raised it with TfB and they are investigating.

Cllr Hornsey suggested that as it does not smell it is not foul water and could be storm water. One of the piped at the culvert in front of Tingewick park is hardly moving, while the other is running quickly, these pick up from the storm drains in Stockley's so that could also indicate a blockage.

Action: Cllr Lightfoot to contact Tom from Anglian Water about the suspected blocked storm water drain, if it is not his department can he point in the PC in the right direction.

- Cllr Swinburne – Cemetery, Grass Cutting and Special Projects.

Not in attendance.

- Cllr Fenemore – Recreation Ground.

Cllr Lightfoot advised that she had spoken to Cllr Fenemore prior to the meeting and he reported that he had arranged for the trim trail to be sprayed for weeds. Once that has been done the trail will be scraped back and gravelled to widen it.

- Cllr Maxwell – Roads.

There have been a number of potholes on the way to Finmere, all have been reported and repaired. The light on the traffic calming measure opposite the school has been reported, though TfB passed the job on to the lighting department.

Action: Cllr Maxwell to follow up with school to see if someone is permitted to enter the school to repair the clock.
